### Class Placements 2020 – LAST OPPORTUNITY

We are just beginning the process of planning for class organisation for 2020. This is a very time consuming process where many variables have to be considered. The process will be similar to previous years. This has allowed parents to make a suggestion based on sound educational reasons that you believe could benefit your child's progress. If you wish to make any comments you will need to put this in writing to me by Monday 28 October, 2019. Please respect that this is the opportunity to make requests based on your child's needs. This can be by letter or email jane.bovill@education.tas.gov.au

As staffing has not been completed and new enrolments have not been finalised, it is impossible to give an indication of which teacher will be teaching at each grade level. Therefore, whilst you may not know who the teacher will be, you can ask for a particular style of teaching that you believe would suit your child. It is likely that there will be changes. It is anticipated that based on our current numbers the configuration of classes will look differently than this year.

Whilst we value your opinion and your request there is no guarantee that your child will be placed where you have requested. There are many considerations when configuring classes to include a balance of gender, social groups, and numbers across grade levels and ability mixes. However, we would always do our best to take your views into account. If you have already had a conversation about placement of your child for next year with the class teacher or senior staff person, it is still necessary to put in writing your request. We cannot accept any recommendations beyond Monday 28 October. Please adhere to this date if you wish your recommendation to be considered. It should also be noted that during the summer break enrolments may change and this may cause the school to reconfigure some classes. Please contact me if you have any queries.
